Anti Human Trafficking

3660 Rescued / Intercepted

Rescue occurs when 3 Angels Nepal rescues a person who is already a slave and has already been trafficked through raids in hotels, interview at the border monitoring stations, and rescue with the help of informants either within the territory of the country or outside Nepal. An interception occurs when a vulnerable client is deemed by staff to have too many risk factors surrounding her situation that she is considered to be possibly in the process of being trafficked.

Our safe haven isn't just open to women who have been trafficked; we also open our doors in Nepal to women escaping from abusive relationships who have nowhere else to turn.

UNEMPLOYED TO EMPLOYER

Jyoti has a son and a daughter. Her husband is still unemployed. They had to depend on daily labour to sustain their livelihood. Jyoti had learnt tailoring skills but no one provided her employment nor did she had funds to buy a sewing machine.

Three years ago, she had heard about the MBMF program while attending one of our AHT awareness activities. When our staff was aware of her situation, she was told that she could become an entrepreneur with the current skills she had.

She was so excited about the prospect of her future when she received the first loan of Rs. 50,000 three years ago. With the help of the fund, she had bought a sewing machine and began her entrepreneurial journey. After she was able to clear the first loan, she received a second loan of Rs. 60,000 to expand her business. With a second loan, she purchased three additional sewing machines. Now she has four employees working in her tailoring shop. Her daily earning was between Rs.3000 to Rs 5000. But after the lockdown, her business has significantly decreased.

She hopes that after the lockdown is lifted, she will have her business going normal. She shares that she is so proud of being able to help her employees even during the time lockdown. She says, if she can properly take care of her employees, then they will take care of her business even in difficult times. We were amazed to witness her journey from the stage of unemployed to an employer. Now, she is BOLD, DETERMINED and EMPOWERED than she was three years ago.

The Widows Cause

The Widow's Cause microfinance project is currently helping thirty widows in two different communities of Makwanpur district through micro-loans. Most of these widows or single women belong to one of the most marginalised groups called Chepang. The lack of easy access to education, healthcare and other opportunities has made this community especially vulnerable to trafficking and other social problems. Some of our children residing at 3 Angels Child Care Homes belong to this community.

INSPIRING COMMUNITY TO HELP

While Janani (not her real name) delivered her baby at the public hospital, she was found to be infected with COVID-19. She was then kept in isolation while her husband was unable to see her and their newborn for two weeks.

Janani and her child were discharged from the hospital after four weeks. However, due to the medical expenses, all their savings were depleted. When they returned to their rented room, they neither had money nor any food left. They had not received any support from their family and relatives as well, and her husband lost his job after the lockdown started.

Both Janani and her husband are avid listeners of 3 Angels Community Radio programs. They then called 3ACR during the live programs to share their problems and ask for help. When the 3ACR team came to their apartment together with one of the listeners who also volunteered to help, they were surprised to see several other listeners already in Janani's place reaching out to them to provide food supplies, clothes for the newborn, and more.

The team learned that these listeners were also able to reach out to other people before, after hearing about their problems through 3ACR programs. These local listeners did not want to be publicized but only desired to help those in need.

We are continually amazed that 3ACR is causing a rippling effect of compassion within the community and among its listeners.




